MINISTRY OF EDUCATION & SCIENCE BUDGET.....

It appears we will have to wait another ten days or so to get official word from the Ministry of Education & Science regarding their support for all of our 2010 Summer Programs.

The first reading of the budget was held on November 24, and the Seimas is expected to vote on the final draft of the new fiscal budget for 2010 on December 10th. Let's keep our fingers crossed that our contract for 2010 will be approved.

LITHUANIANS TO BECOME MEMBERS OF A.P.P.L.E.....

Initial reactions from our early contacts with Lithuanian teachers and administrators have been extremely positive to our initiative to have Lithuanian Nationals become members of A.P.P.L.E.

Those contacted were primarily teachers and administrators who were especially interested in participating as Guest Lecturers, Team Teachers, volunteers and joining the A.P.P.L.E. Team as members. The most common sentiments expressed were those of appreciation for being given the opportunity to become an integral part of an organization that has done so much for their educational system and our recognition that they are willing and able to now begin to contribute as partners in that process.

For those U.S. based participants in the Summer Programs for 2010 who may be considering working with a Lithuanian counterpart as a Guest Lecturer or Team Teacher, etc. please note the following: The same guidelines will now apply to those Lithuanian partners as apply to us, ie, they must become official members of A.P.P.L.E. prior to participating in our programs. Ann Petroliunas has her Master's degree in teaching special education and currently works with high school students with learning disabilities in the Chicago, Illinois area. At OPRF High School, she teaches science through the learning development progam, directs the Orchesis Dance Company, and sponsores the Dance Club. In her often non-existent spare time, she enjoys dancing and taking pictures, and is working on learning the lithuanian language."

My Lithuania has no present. It has a past and it has a future. It is my history and it is my potential. I am grateful to my father for connecting me to my past. I am grateful to A.P.P.L.E. for letting me into Lithuania's future.

Last summer was my second trip to Lithuania and my first work with A.P.P.L.E. I reconnected with a cousin, explored the many regions of the country, and ate a lot of saltibarscai and potatoes. Mostly though, my summer was spent falling in love with a group of kids with disabilities who were part of A.P.P.L.E.'s program at Camp Viltis. I struggled with not knowing the language and wanting to connect. I struggled with the teachers' rigid views and refusal to believe in these learners. I struggled with my own frustrations of belonging to a culture that I knew so little

about and was having such trouble accessing. At the end of it all, the smiles and the laughter of these children were looped on repeat in my brain, and there was never any doubt I'd be back.

This summer, I made it a point to address many of my prior frustrations. I called up my reconnected cousin and asked to live with him and his family. I enrolled in a Lithuanian language program at the University of Vilnius. I went to the family farm in Kacergine to visit my grandmother's last living siblings. I made connections I was desperate for in knowing my past Lithuania. And I got a glimpse into Lithuania's future.

At Camp Viltis, I was overjoyed to see some of the same faces as last year, play our favorite games, and see how they'd grown. The new students were just as precious and brought with them so much for me to learn. A teacher from our 2008 group came back with stories of acceptance and belonging as she navigated through her first year of including a child with cerebral palsy in her 2nd grade class. This year's group of teachers was creative, energetic, and optimistic. They believed a little bit more in each of the students and fit the Viltis (hope) name. Personally, I know a few more words, a few more stories, and have a better sense of where I came from. Collectively, the A.P.P.L.E. program at Camp Viltis created a community and these teachers have a vision for Lithuanian education that is welcoming to all. My past Lithuania is starting to take shape and future Lithuania looks pretty bright.

Committee Quarterly Reports

The 4TH Quarter Report of the Annual Fund Committee

Based on our last fiscal report, we all see the need to address our responsibilities to significantly address fund-raising. In this difficult economic time, we need a variety of fund-raising options that will attract broader groups of contributors and encourage them to support our cause.

In that spirit, we are asking all Members of the Board and Officers to commit to identifying innovative and creative ways to generate \$1,000 in contributions per Board Member or Officer over the next eight months. Some ideas to consider:

- DEVELOPED NEW INITIATIVE TO OPEN A.P.P.L.E.MEMBERSHIP TO LITHUANIAN NATIONALS. Approved at August meeting. Guidelines were approved by President on 9/27/09; available for distribution 1/1/10.
- STRENGTHENING A.P.P.L.E. THROUGH COMMUNICATION. Developing a sense of team among our officers, Board of Directors and members has become an important point of focus for our committee. Most people would agree that communication is a cornerstone element within all successful teams. To that end, we will begin publishing an e-zine on a monthly basis to keep all members of A.P.P.L.E. informed about our plans, activities, works in progress, concerns and needs. It will be timely, informative and open to participation by all members. We anticipate the first issue to be published prior to December 15.
